Your one-page, abstract will be used to determine if your project will be included in the symposium. You should also have copies available to audience members at the event. Therefore, the abstract must be clear, concise, and accessible to educated people who are outside of your field of expertise. Your abstract must be one-page in length (12 point font) and should include:

- The title of your presentation
- Your name and graduate program
- The names and departmental affiliation of co-authors (if any).
- The name and title of the faculty member who recommended this project for the symposium.
- The abstract itself, which should accentuate the purpose of the study, its significance, and the results.
